The 'Last' Mile

This was the title of the 2007 London Walk which took place on Saturday 16th June under the guidance of one of our members, Malcolm Dick, a specialist lecturer in History of London and a City of London Guide. Twelve members and guests gathered at Mile End Underground Station at 10.30a.m. on a warm but blustery morning with showers forecast. We set off by walking through Mile End Park, with its impressive water feature, of which none of us were aware; an example of the open spaces which have recently been created as part of the redevelopment of this area of London.

Malcolm then led us down to the towpath on the side of the Regents Canal where he described its history. The Canal opened on the 1st August 1820 and was built to link the Grand Union Canal at Paddington with the River Thames at Limehouse. We followed the towpath passing the remains of canal-side warehouses, some of which had been converted to museums, drop-in cafes, etc. We saw several locks which are kept in good working order by British Waterways, for this is still a canal in regular use although now for canal pleasure boats rather than the industrial barges of the past. A gas manufacturing plant fed with coal delivered by barge had been alongside the canal at one point , however the area was now being converted into a huge housing development and the only reminder of the past were the remains of the wharf on the canal. *continued overleaf*

We then arrived at Limehouse Basin which is now a marina packed with pleasure craft of all shapes and sizes, gone are all the warehouses and these are replaced with good looking blocks of apartments, very desirable and very expensive! After watching craft enter and leave the lock giving access to the Thames from the Basin, we joined the Thames Path to walk along the river to Wapping. On the way we were able to enjoy the sight of a Thames barge race in which the large barges are rowed by teams of rowers – a very energetic pastime!

Thus we arrived at 1.30p.m. at the Prospect of Whitby pub to enjoy a very welcome pint followed by an excellent lunch in a private room overlooking the Thames kindly arranged by Malcolm. The weather was kind to us with only a brief shower during the walk, the promised downpour arriving whilst we were having lunch, like the walk well planned by Malcolm!
